Flowering Perennials & Trees

	<p>Heteromeles arbutifolia (Christmas Berry, Toyon) Sun to part shade & low water. Found in coastal sage scrub and chaparral habitat throughout California. This large evergreen shrub grows 10-15' tall with white flowers in the summer and bright red berry clusters in the winter. It is a great plant for attracting pollinators and wild birds. One Gallon \$9.95 (Wholesale \$4.95)</p>		<p>Sequoia sempervirens (Coast Redwood) Sun to part shade & low to moderate water. Coast Redwood can towers to heights of ~60' within a person's lifetime and ~350' max in several 100 years. Prefers areas with wet winters and cool, foggy summers. Provides habitat for squirrels and nesting birds. DP40 cone \$9.95 (Wholesale \$4.95) One Gallon \$9.95 (Wholesale \$4.95)</p>
	<p>Achillea millefolium (Yarrow) Sun to part shade & low to moderate water. Yarrow has beautiful white flower clusters and delicate lacy leaves. Grows ~2' tall, spreads through rhizomes, and can create a ground cover. It is hardy and can handle poor soil, hot summers, steep slopes, and occasional foot traffic. Easy to maintain by simply cutting back old flower stalks to the base. Attracts a wide range of pollinators. LT6 Cone \$3.95 (Wholesale \$1.50) One Gallon \$9.95 (Wholesale \$4.95)</p>		<p>Lupinus arboreus (Yellow Bush Lupine) Sun & low water. Found in CA coastal dune and bluff habitat. The sweet fragrance of the 12" yellow flower spikes will attract many pollinators and human admirers. Readily reseeds itself, and seeds that do not sprout make great forage for birds and small mammals. It is also a host plant to many native moths and butterflies. 	<p>Mimulus aurantiacus (Sticky Monkeyflower) Sun to part shade & low water. Found in a wide range of habitats with rocky or sandy hillsides, cliffs, and canyon slopes. This cantaloupe-colored flowering shrub is great for dry gardens and any areas that needs an extra pop of color. Attracts many native butterflies, bees and hummingbirds. Grows ~5'x5' max and can be pruned back by 50% in the late fall. LT6 Cone \$5.95 (Wholesale \$3.95) One Gallon \$9.95 (Wholesale \$4.95)</p>		<p>Scrophularia californica (Bee Plant) Part shade & low to moderate water. Great for pollinator gardens, attracting not only bees but also butterflies, hummingbirds, and flower flies. This semi-herbaceous perennial has broad serrated leaves with stalks of small maroon flowers. One Gallon \$9.95 (Wholesale \$4.95)</p>
	<p>Pinus radiata (Monterey Pine) Full sun & low water. Is a coniferous evergreen tree growing to 200 ft in cultivation and up to 49'-98' in height in the wild. In the wild it grows in coastal bluffs and dunes along the coastal fog belt. Prefers sandy soils. Provides habitat for nesting birds. Tree Pot \$11.95 (Wholesale \$5.95)</p>		<p>Arctostaphylos pumila (Sandmat Manzanita) Sun & little to no summer water once established. Sandmat Manzanita creates a beautiful mounding groundcover with silvery matte leaves. It likes cool coastal environments with sandy, well draining soil. Its little clusters of white/pink bell flowers attract many pollinators and its berries are eaten by small mammals and birds. One Gallon \$13.95 (Wholesale \$9.95)</p>
