Flowering Perennials



Oenothera elata (Hooker's Evening Primrose)
Part shade to full sun, with seasonal tolerance of high and low moisture. Like other evening primroses, this species closes at midday, creating some diversity to the pollinator visiting schedule. Be prepared for Hooker's Evening Primrose to spread prolifically through seed once established. Expect to see more hummingbirds and finches through your window when Oenothera elata is in bloom.

Ribes sanguineum (Red Flowering Currant)
Part shade and low to moderate water, this currant species grows up to 13 feet tall and is sure to attract pollinators in the summer months. The striking pink flowers juxtaposed with bright green foliage can be seen in very early spring after breaking dormancy. Though not very tasty to you or I, these berries will attract a variety of native bird species.

Iris douglasiana (Douglas Iris)
Sun to partial shade & occasional to moderate water. Found from sunny coastal prairies to the redwood forest. Has strikingly large flowers that range from blue-ish purple to buttery yellow and attracts a wide range of pollinators. Will form spreading clumps of dark green leaf blades. Prefers heavy soil with organic matter.

Eriogonum parvifolium
(Seacliff Buckwheat)
Full sun and low moisture, these sea cliff buckweats are an incredible pollinator species. Adaptable to many sunny garden situations. Growing up to 3+ feet tall and wide, this shrub attracts a variety of butterflies and birds and looks great draped over walls or slopes.

Euthamia occidentalis (Goldenrod)
An excellent species for part shade to sun, in moist to wet areas on your property. Goldenrod has vibrant, yellow flowers that kick in after the early season species are fading, and can grow as tall as 7 feet in ideal conditions. Add some flowers to your stream retention efforts with a species that does well in coastal and inland climates.

Grindelia stricta (Gumplant)
Sun to part shade & moderate water. This perennial varies in form, from a low groundcover to a subshrub up to 3+ ft high. Ask for help in picking the form you prefer. Bright yellow flowers and buds attract butterflies. Deadheading maintenance helps encourage flower growth.

Asclepias fascicularis (Narrow-leaf Milkweed)
Full sun and little to moderate water, this narrow-leaf milkweed is a larval host plant that supports our local Santa Cruz monarchs! Be prepared to see caterpillars snacking on your milkweed, with the knowledge that you are supporting the monarch population. It is crucial that no pesticides are used on this plant in order to protect the health of the monarchs. Please note, we do not encourage planting Milkweed within 5 miles of the coast.

Stipa pulchra (Purple Needle Grass)
Liven up your drought tolerant landscape with California's state grass! Requiring sun and no water after establishment, this grass is ideal for grasslands, chaparral habitat, or your backyard. This species thrives in virtually every soil type, and is an excellent ground cover. Individual plants can live to be 200 years old, with roots to 20 feet deep!
