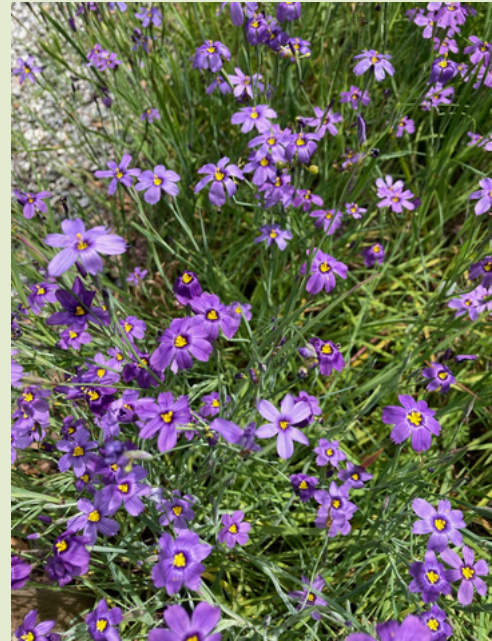

Sisyrinchium bellum

(blue-eyed grass)

4 inch @ \$8.95 1 Gallon @ \$15.95

- 1 to 2 feet tall and 1 to 2 feet wide.
- Can be grown in full sun to part shade.
- Flowers from January to July, and easily self seeds.
- Grows best in meadows and woodlands.
- Included on several fire-resistant plant lists.



Castilleja latifolia w/ *Eriophyllum staechadifolium*

(Monterey paintbrush / wooly sunflower)

Two plants in one pot!!! 1 Gallon @ 24.95

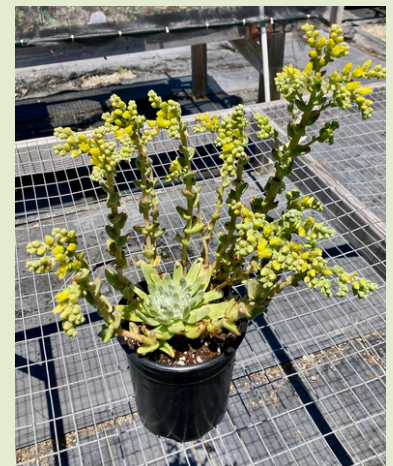
- 2 to 5 feet tall and 4 to 5 feet wide.
- The *Eriophyllum* is a suitable host plant for the *Castilleja*, native to coastal bluffs.
- Thrives in full sun to part shade, and sandy soils.
- Attractive to birds, bees, and other pollinators.

Dudleya caespitosa

(coast Dudleya)

1 Gallon @ \$13.95

- 4 to 8 inches tall and 4 to 6 inches wide.
- Grows in part to full sun, and fast draining soils.
- Produces many small bright flowers.
- Looks great in rock gardens.

Morella californica

(wax myrtle)

TP4 @ \$15.95

- 8 to 20 feet tall and up to 20 feet wide.
- Can grown in full sun to part shade.
- Stays green all year, accepts heavy pruning, making it a great choice for a hedge.
- Fast growing, and can tolerate a wide range of soil types.

Symphotrichum chilense

(Pacific aster)

1 Gallon @ \$11.95

- 2 to 4 feet tall and 3 feet wide.
- Blooms during summer and fall.
- Its deep roots help stabilize slopes.
- Late season flowers loved by bumble bees and butterflies.



Asclepias fascicularis

& *A. eriocarpa*

(narrowleaf milkweed / woolypod milkweed)

LT6 @ \$5.95

- 2 to 3 feet tall and 2 to 3 feet wide.
- Important host plant for the monarch butterfly.
- Blooms summer and fall, and will die back during winter months.
